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Sand Castles – Director’s notes

This is the third time I have directed this wonderful little play by Bob Larbey. Creator of Television classics *The Good Life* and *Ever Decreasing Circles*, Larbey excels at getting across the voice of the ordinary person and highlighting the absurdities of everyday life. He sees humour in the mundane and manages to introduce pathos for good measure. And each new actor and actress that take on the roles manage to also find different nuances and meanings within the script and the action. So whilst the story may seem an innocent and simple tale, the many levels that it works on and the messages it has about relationships, is always pertinent.

Outdoor productions carry their own challenges and the actors, stage crew and technical crew should be commended for their flexibility and courage, especially if the weather is less than kind to them. When you examine what actors actually do it is quite remarkable. They make themselves vulnerable and run the risk of suffering severe and acute embarrassment in the pursuit of telling a story. The great comedian and Actor George Burns said: “Acting is all about honesty. If you can fake that, you’ve got it made!” Well I hope you are entertained and amused and can suspend your disbelief for an enjoyable couple of hours this evening and let the Village Players tell this lovely, simple story with honesty and skill.

About the Director – Helen Halliday

Having trained at Guildford school of Acting, Helen has directed musicals and plays across the country. Her roles in theatre have included Eliza Doolittle (*My Fair Lady*: Wakefield Opera House) Nellie Forbush (*South Pacific*: The Dome, Brighton) Sally Bowles (*Cabaret*: Theatre Royal, Bath) Olivia (*Twelfth Night*: Touring Production) Sally Hardcastle (*Love On The Dole*: World Premier, Guildford). She has a best supporting actress nomination for her portrayal of Rachel in Alan Ayckbourn’s *Seasons Greetings* and to date has written 10 plays, all of which have been performed.

Scene 3: The end of the season.

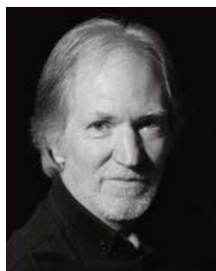

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The history of the (not so humble) beach hut

"Beach huts epitomise escapism," asserts photographer Iain Mckell. "I grew up by the seaside in Weymouth in Dorset and have always been fascinated by all this great British seaside stuff: wind breakers, Kiss Me Quick Hats, Punch and Judy shows, fish and chips, Amusement Arcades, but it is the beach hut that really fascinates me. They are a cultural extension of suburbia."

Indeed the common or garden beach hut is a great British prerequisite. Formerly known as bathing machines they once stood on wheels and were first adopted by Mad King George III who used said monstrosity in 1801 but were popularised by Queen Victoria who installed one at Osborne House in 1840. Initially designed to protect the modesty of the female bathers who changed within their construct, the 'Bathing Machine' was a basic wooden box that was pushed down to the seas edge by moustachioed chaps from which the prospective lady bathers would emerge.

By the time the First World War erupted the British seaside spirit was in full bloom as motorised transport took thousands of families en masse to bathe in the restorative waters of the not so clean seas. Once dull fishing ports like Blackpool, Brighton and Bournemouth were reinvented as bustling entertainment centres crammed full of melting ice cream and screaming infants who crowded their shores.

And so bloomed the beach hut, a much-desired item that the covetous middle classes rented or owned so to protect their little piece of England in which they might hang up their corsets and collars. Families would travel to the seaside and plot up in said box using it as a base of operations and home for the families deck chairs, buckets, spades and Bunsen burners on which they made the all important tea. If the old adage "An English man's home is his castle," rings true then his beach huts is his country retreat.

In the thirties the beach hut became fashionable as George V spent a day in said construct with Queen Mary near Beachy Head. Since then, beach huts have been owned by the likes of actors such as Laurence Olivier, John Mills and Kenneth Williams and even Princess Diana's parents Lord and Lady Spencer, while errant artist Tracy Emin even sold hers to the Saatchi gallery for £100,000. "It had stood in Whitstable in Kent for 25 years before I had it," said the artist regarding the chip board and corrugated hut she entitled, 'The last Thing I Said To You Is Don't Leave Me Here.' "It travelled to America and back again. It had life like a tent, it had real spirit." Unfortunately for art lovers Emin's hut was lost in the great fire that consumed the Saatchi art collection in 2004 but curiously it was not the most expensive hut ever sold.

Although such constructions do appear in other more exotic locations the almost too cute for words candy coloured beach hut is a quintessentially English phenomenon. Once the domain of aged grand parents the ethic now attracts otherwise sane individuals who think nothing of parking themselves outside, what is ostensibly a wooden shed with no water or electricity, cooking off a Calor Gas stove and drinking warm beer for what might be days on end. In the UK today there are, without the slightest touch of irony, beach hut websites, beach hut associations, beach hut newsletters and even an artist, Mike Kingston, who specialises in oil paintings of beach huts.



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
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The Village Players

The group owes its existence to Angie Trew for it was thanks to her vision that the first pantomime was produced at The Dunn Village Hall in 1992. Having "recruited" Anita Gunn and Jimi Jervis Read to the team, the enthusiasm and creative skills of these three ladies ensured that the pantomime was a great success and this led to the formation of The Village Pantomime Players later that year.

Under the leadership of Angie, and then Anita, the group went on to produce a variety of plays, comedies (in a Café Theatre style) and musicals. In 2003 the name was changed to The Village Players to reflect the group's commitment to providing the village with a wide variety of entertainment. Sadly, Angie lost her courageous battle against cancer in September 2009 but her legacy lives on.
